1. Firstly, I apologize to anyone who got cut off on the phone.
2. EPA and FEMA have had ongoing discussions of requirements for funding. A fuller discussion of the status of these efforts and the next steps for indoor air will take place at the next Task Force meeting on Wednesday.
-Sensitive issue. FEMA was a willing partner. Our progressive efforts with EPA and the Feds should only promote continuity of the same.
 Sam Benson reported on organizing a future national effort to discuss coordinated environmental response for future disasters. He will be developing a funding proposal and seeks input from any interested task force members.
-Good. Let Alexander create a fiefdom on a national level.
4. HPD has completed a survey of 2,264 buildings below Canal and is in the process of putting the information, including photos, into a database.
-What type of survey? Did we see it?
5. On the data front, Doug Williamson of PlanGraphics will be taking a new position, and OEM will discuss with DOITT how to move our efforts forward. Doug, Vince Coluccio, and the data group have a building blueprint map that is ready for environmental data. They will start with data for asbestos. The group will meet on Tuesday.

6. OEM will look into the "eyesores" issue - who has the data of buildings close to the site that have not been cleaned?
