EPA has tested the air in lower Manhattan more than 1000 X — and has concluded that it does not show dangerous levels of contamination.

Comm. Nade, DEP, the air quality can cause nagging discomfort (burning eyes, tears, skin rashes, sore throats) — not a health concern.

Samples from OSHA (Occupational Safety & Health Admin.) indicate no airborne asbestos or other contaminants beyond the disaster site.

Mr. Nade stated he understood the lung "it's human nature" — He said the real respiratory concern should be the unfitted diesel smoke coming from the rescue & construction vehicles in the ground zero "mess" —

② Officials have tested for asbestos + metals - lead, iron oxide, zinc oxide, copper, beryllium - and soot, that might create health hazards, as well as other pollutants.

* None of the metals exceeded OSHA limits. Tests show that there have been occasional spikes in soot levels which appear to be associated with the flare-up of fires within the wreckage.

EPA, OSHA, NYCDOH - indicate that there was no reason for general health concern. (Spikes near the epicenter, but nothing that reveals a health risk.)

* of 442 asbestos samples taken, only 27 exceeded EPA standards - on a transient basis.

- ③ Since the first days after the attack, asbestos levels in dust in the red zone have almost all been below the concentration at which the mineral is even technically defined to exist - 1% of the total mass of a sample.

Some findings by EPA + DEP show on their website certain days + places where levels exceeded safety standards, But these standards are for inside a building — not the air outside which disperses quickly,

- * While the quality of the air may indeed be below certain safety standards, it is not dangerous,

The agencies use the indoor standard to be cautious + because a safety standard for outdoor air does not exist.
