PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

Date: July 8, 2002

Sec. 1. Pursuant to the powers vested in me by Executive Law §24 and the New York State Executive Law Article 2-B, I hereby declare a State of Emergency in the five boroughs of New York City.

Sec. 2. This State of Emergency has been declared because of terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center causing a great many deaths, injuries and extensive damage to buildings and infrastructure in Lower Manhattan. These conditions imperil the public safety.

Sec. 3. During the State of Emergency, the following orders shall be in effect:

- a. All vehicular and pedestrian traffic may be restricted south of Canal Street, starting on West Street running east to the intersection of Rutgers Street, and then east on Rutgers Street to South Street in Manhattan, as detailed on the annexed map.
 - (i) Persons granted access to sector D on the annexed map in order to perform services, retrieve property, report news, or for another valid purpose must possess and display a valid

authorization pass. Such authorization is limited to performing the approved activity, and then the person must immediately leave the area.

- (ii) No vehicles other than passenger cars containing two persons or more, authorized buses, and two or three axle single unit trucks will be permitted to enter Manhattan via the Holland Tunnel between 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. At all other times, passenger cars containing less than two persons, authorized buses, and two or three axle single unit trucks will be permitted to enter Manhattan via the Holland Tunnel. No vehicles other than passenger cars and authorized buses shall be permitted to exit Manhattan via the Holland Tunnel. All passenger cars containing fewer than two persons shall be prohibited from entering Manhattan via any bridge or tunnel with an entry point south of 14th Street between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m., Monday through Friday. The prohibition set forth immediately above shall not include: authorized emergency vehicles; passenger cars with official, commercial or NYP plates; vehicles carrying medical personnel; hearses; motorcycles; vehicles with NYC special parking identification permits for the disabled; medallion taxi cabs and livery vehicles authorized by the NYC Taxi and

Limousine Commission; Access-A- Ride vehicles; or ambulettes.

(iii) Unless authorized by the Police Commissioner, Fire Commissioner or the Commissioner of Emergency Management, the occupancy and use of commercial and manufacturing buildings in Manhattan is prohibited within the boundaries of Sector D on the annexed map.

(iv) The area identified as the inner perimeter of Sector D on the annexed map is an active crime scene. No photographic equipment or video equipment may be brought into the area or used, except with the approval of the Police Commissioner. Unauthorized cameras, film, video equipment, videotapes and similar devices are subject to seizure.

(v) Any and all contractors, sub-contractors, workers and employees shall be required to deliver all scrap metal, debris and other materials that are removed from the World Trade Center disaster area/crime scene directly to the specific locations which are provided to them by those persons lawfully in charge of such removal. Directions and routes shall be provided to the truck operators, contractors, sub-contractors or their designees and no deviation from those directions or specific routes shall be permitted without prior

approval from a supervisory officer of the N.Y.P.D. The N.Y.P.D. is authorized to oversee such removal and any person in violation of the terms contained in this provision, including being off a designated route, shall be punished to the fullest extent of the law, and may have his or her vehicle seized for forfeiture and Trade Waste Commission license or registration revoked.

Sec. 4. I hereby direct the Police, Fire, Emergency Management, and Health Commissioners to take whatever steps are necessary to preserve the public safety and to render all required and available assistance to protect the security, well-being and health of the residents of the City.

Sec. 5. Any person who knowingly violates any provision of this Order is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.

Sec. 6. This Order shall take effect immediately. It shall remain in effect for five days unless it is terminated at an earlier date. The Proclamation dated July 3, 2002 is hereby terminated.
