I just received a call from [PII] who resides at [PII] [PII] (and who we've heard from several times here at the hotline regarding indoor air quality, etc.) Her most recent complaint is regarding an apparently serious mold issue all over the inside of her apartment/building. It seems that the mold problem began because the landlord of her building didn't handle the refrigerators and freezers that were left when residents left the building following 9/11 and now he refuses to do anything about the situation. [PII] has spoken with HPD and they have classified the mold a Code "C" violation--I'm not sure what that specifies--but they don't have the jurisdiction to handle it.

Roger suggested I email you to see what the next step should be. Is there someone [PII] could contact who could come to her building and culture the mold or anything?
