SIGNS & SYMPTOMS OF EXPOSURE:

Eyes: Moderate to severe irritation

Skin: Irritation due to defatting of tissue

Ingestion: Nausea, headache, vomiting

Inhalation: Nausea, dizziness, coordination impairment on long exposure

CARCINOGENICITY: Methylene Chloride listed as a carcinogen by IARC, NIP

EMERGENCY FIRST AID PROCEDURES:

Eyes: Flush with large amounts of water for 15 minutes and get medical attention.

Skin: Wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. Get medical attention.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. Give oxygen if breathing is difficult. Get medical attention.
